GURIASO LANGUAGE PROFILE

SANDAUN PROVINCE, PAPUA NEW GUINEA



The Guriaso people (grx), known almost exclusively among themselves as the Muno, live in a flat area of the Sandaun Province of Papua New Guinea. Surrounded by the Fas to the north, Kwomtari to the west, and Seta to the east, their language is not related to any of these neighboring languages.

Elementary schools are located in multiple villages for grades one through three. One primary school is available through grade eight. If a student goes on to high school, he will board away from home, as it is a three day walk or one day car ride to the nearest high school.


Christian Brethren Church, Catholic
